

COVID-19 Self Assessment:

You must NOT enter the church if you have any of the following:

- have been exposed to someone with COVID-19
- are sick, including even one of the slightest symptoms or feelings of sickness, especially upper respiratory or flu-like symptoms, such as fever, cough, headache, aches & pains, sore throat, chills, runny nose, loss of sense of taste or smell or shortness of breath or difficulty breathing.

LENT is the yearly celebration by the Church of its corporate conversion in Jesus Christ. Lent prepares the faithful for Easter, as they recall their Baptism and do penance in preparation for the greatest Feast of the Year.

Lenten penance, based on the teachings of the Gospels, includes fasting, almsgiving, prayer and works of mercy.

Christian fasting obtains its full meaning when we deprive ourselves of food in order to be more open to prayer, to share more in the suffering of those who are starving, and to save money to give to the poor. Fasting is a penitential discipline intended to open our hearts to God and others, a means of purification and spiritual liberation, a witness of the depth of our faith.
